Employment contract	Once you have been hired as an assistant and have signed your Ph.D. agreement and employment contract, you will be given a temporary contract for one year. You will be required to submit and present a research proposal within the first 9 months of your employment. In case of a successful presentation, your contract will be extended for another 3 years. Curriculum	To graduate, you must not only write your dissertation, but also earn credits, similar to your undergraduate and graduate studies. In total, you must earn 18 credit points. You will be required to present one of your papers at the department's Economics Lunch and at an international conference. You will receive 3 credits for each of these, leaving 12 credits in courses. 9 of these must come from the module "Professional and Methodological Training".
