Employment Contract	During the first semester, a doctoral agreement is signed between the doctoral candidate and the major professor. The <u>Doctoral Agreement</u> includes a preliminary study plan and schedule for the doctoral program, any requirements and general conditions, and the proposed selection of options to achieve the program objectives (number of credit points) - a personalized curriculum. In addition, regular meetings are recommended to explicitly discuss whether the doctoral program is progressing according to the doctoral agreement. Dissertation and Contribution	The dissertation is an independent research project and must demonstrate the doctoral candidate's ability to work independently and to meet the scholarly requirements of the topic. A dissertation may be submitted as either a cumulative dissertation or a monograph. A cumulative dissertation consists of at least one published or accepted for publication peer-reviewed article (of which the doctoral researcher is the first author) and at least two additional articles (of which the doctoral researcher is the first or co-author) that have been submitted to, accepted for publication in, or published in a peer-reviewed journal, plus a 10- to 20-page abstract that integrates the research results into a coherent research strategy and research question, and that clearly demonstrates the doctoral researcher's personal contribution. The format of the dissertation, with the exception of the <u>cover</u> sheet and the declaration of scientific integrity, is not specified and will be worked out with the primary supervisor.	https:/psychologie.unibas.ch/en/studies/doctoral-studies/

Curriculum	 Doctoral students are responsible for the successful completion of at least 12 ECTS within the program. The required ECTS can be obtained from the following three areas (1-3); at least two-thirds must be obtained in areas 1 and 2: 1. External scientific courses related to the dissertation topic 2. Internal scientific courses related to the dissertation topic 3. Teaching and other educational activities Areas 1 and 2 include doctoral level courses related to the dissertation topic at the Faculty of Psychology of the University of Basel or at other universities. Doctoral students are required to attend research courses at the Faculty of Psychology on a regular basis, even if they are not directly related to the dissertation topic. All doctoral students at the Faculty of Psychology are required to be enrolled at the University of Basel for the entire duration of their doctoral studies.
