## 2. Comment on the year 2013

In 2013, after the six-year dormancy of the umbrella organization at the University of Basel, the Assistants' Association of the University of Basel was revived under the name "avuba". The need for a central contact point to deal with the concerns of assistants was expressed both by Group III members and by the University Administration. The Group III Senate members set the ball rolling in 2013, and the avuba co-presidents for 2013 (Kasper Renggli and Florian Kuhlmey) and an administrator (Patricia Eiche) were appointed in the 2013 Spring semester.

Work continued on the Bylaws until the 2013 Fall semester, and the Performance Agreement was negotiated with the Rectorate. The Rectorate declared its willingness to support avuba with a maximum annual deficit guarantee of CHF 50,000. The website www.avuba.unibas.ch was also launched in German and English.

The first General Meeting took place on September 9, 2013. Technical problems meant that invitations were not sent to all members, and so a second General Meeting was held on December 16, 2013 in the Regenzzimmer. The Performance Agreement and Bylaws were approved in December (with a few minor amendments) and the Co-Presidium was confirmed for 2014.

# 3. Details of the individual items

#### Personnel expenses

From April 2013, Kasper Renggli and Florian Kuhlmey were both remunerated for a 20% workload based on SNSF salaries. Patricia Eiche worked for avuba from May 2013 with a 40% workload.

#### **Operating expenses**

#### Third-party services

Third-party services encompass both commissioning a graphic designer for the avuba logo (including the avuba manual) for CHF 4,050 and fees of CHF 12,052 for English translations. These fees of around CHF 12,000 include costs of CHF 8,800 for the English translation of the redesigned skuba vademecum. This will be made available End of March 2014 as a downloadable PDF on both the skuba and avuba homepages. The invoice for programming the avuba website (around CHF 2,000) will be posted in invoice year 2014.

# Office supplies

Office supplies include stationery, printer cartridges and copies of documents at General Meetings.

#### Non-travel and travel expenses

This includes the rail ticket for Marius Osterfeld, a doctoral student at the University of Fribourg, who attended the avuba General Meeting on September 9, 2013 to present actionuni, the association for teaching and research assistants in Switzerland. These expenses also include a rail ticket for Patricia Eiche to travel to Bern to find out about the assistants' association at the University of Bern.

#### Advertising and representation

Advertising and representation encompasses CHF 2,237 for refreshments at the two General Meetings. CHF 1,000 was contributed to the Talent Promotion Office for the reception for early career researchers.

## Allocations from university funds

In the absence of other academic and non-academic projects requiring funding in 2013, CHF 10,000 was provided to skuba's Caffè Bologna project.

# Own income

Since the 2013 Fall semester, avuba has imposed a membership fee of CHF 15. Newly enrolled doctoral students are exempt from this fee in their first semester. In the 2013 Fall semester, CHF 43,710 / CHF 15 = 2,914 members paid a fee. According to the list provided to avuba by Student Services, 2,551 doctoral students were enrolled as avuba members in the 2013 Fall semester. At the same time, the HR department notified avuba of 605 postdoctoral avuba members.

# Deficit guarantee

According to the 2013 annual report, avuba accrued expenses of CHF 84,010 in comparison to own income of CHF 43,710. This produces a deficit of CHF 40,300, which is covered by the deficit guarantee. Therefore, avuba's annual result for 2013 is CHF 0.

#### 4. Auditors' comments

Marc Stalder of the Faculty of Law and Matthias Fastenrath of the Faculty of Psychology reviewed the avuba annual report on March 18, 2014 and March 24, 2014 respectively and have no further comments.

# 5. Outlook

In 2014, avuba will offer lunchtime meetings on academic and non-academic topics. A newsletter will also be sent out every quarter. A budget of CHF 10,000 is also available for supporting academic and non-academic projects. CHF 5,000 is to be paid out twice a year to projects relating specifically to teaching and research assistants, with a maximum rate of CHF 500 per project. According to the planned values for 2014, we can assume that the financial contribution from the University (around CHF 40,000) will be similar to that for 2013.
